We would like to welcome you and your child to the 2024 Lewisboro Teen Treks 5-day camp program. We are very excited to bring this full travel camp to our residents. We hope the following information will be helpful in making your child's summer an enjoyable one. We would like to remind you that camp home base will be at **John Jay High School** this summer.

We have added some new trips this year and have once again offered some of our more popular trips. We hope the enclosed information will be helpful to you in planning for your child's Teen Treks experience.

This year we will be running 3 different buses - two for the 3-day program and one for the 5-day program. In an ideal world, your camper(s) would be able to pick the bus they would like to ride, but due to strict Health Department regulations as well as the Recreation Department policies your camper is assigned to a particular bus and there will be **NO switching**. All buses will follow a schedule which has them attending most of the same trips (with the exception of iFly and Spins).

The first day of camp is sometimes a difficult situation for parents, campers, and staff. We hope the information outlined in this booklet will minimize any confusion or questions you may have. Therefore, we encourage you to take the time to read and understand this booklet and the policies and procedures contained within, and to please feel free to call should you have any questions.

We look forward to having your campers with us this summer and we are committed to providing a safe, fun-filled camp experience for them.

General Camp Information

Staff

The Town of Lewisboro Teen Treks Program is run under the direction of a trained staff of professionals and counselors. Our Teen Treks Directors are educators in the state of New York. Our counselors are all college students or graduates with prior experience as a camp counselor or experience working with children, especially with this age group.

Our Aquatics Director is Jessie Crane. This is Jessie's first year as Aquatics Administrator, and it is her second year working in aquatics at the Lewisboro Town Pool. She previously worked at the Bedford Golf & Tennis Club. Jessie will be working with her assistant, Ryan Giner, and a team of eleven instructors/lifeguards this upcoming summer overseeing the Town Camp Aquatics.

The Town of Lewisboro works cooperatively with the Katonah-Lewisboro School District who provides all transportation to and from camp under supervision of our transportation coordinator Chris DiLillo. He has been employed with The Town of Lewisboro Parks and Rec summer camp program since 2011. He is so happy to have such an experienced transportation staff, that will make for a safe, enjoyable, and successful 2024 summer camp.

Under New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations, we must have one staff member per 200 campers certified in CPR for the Professional Rescuer and one staff member per 200 campers certified in American Red Cross Responding to Emergencies First Aid. The Town of Lewisboro Teen Camp exceeds these requirements.

Permit

The Town of Lewisboro Teen Camp Program:

- 1) Must have a permit to operate from the Westchester County Health Department
- 2) Is required to be inspected twice yearly

Inspection reports and required camp written safety, medical, and fire safety plans are on file at the Westchester County Health Department, Bureau of Public Health Protection located in Mt. Kisco, NY and are available for your review.

Rainy Days

In the event of inclement weather/rain, a rainy day schedule will be implemented, i.e.; bowling, movie, etc.

Please be advised that trips that are cancelled due to bad weather may not always be able to be rescheduled. Also, please note, trips that are cancelled due to inclement weather that were

scheduled for a late pick-up (after 3:00 pm) will be picked up at **3:00 pm**, therefore, campers must be picked up where they were dropped off that morning or at their respective bus stop. Should you have any questions as to the time of pick-up, please call the Recreation Office at (914) 232-6162, or check out our website www.lewisbororecreation.com under CAMP, or Facebook under Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department.

Swimming

On occasion, campers may swim at the Town Park Pool for recreational swimming. This will usually occur when a trip is leaving late. In addition, swimming trips to various swimming facilities/water parks may have been planned. Under New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations, all non-swimmers must be readily identifiable, i.e.; wear a bathing cap, wrist band, etc. The Town of Lewisboro Teen Camp will be using neon wristbands to identify our non-swimmers. In addition, our campers who are classified as swimmers will be wearing a different colored neon wristband. This has been added as an extra level of safety to ensure that a non-swimmer cannot take off their wristband and proceed to a swimmer area (which formerly did not use wristbands). Therefore, all campers must wear a wristband in order to swim. Wristbands will be given to each camper and then collected after their swim time.

ALL CAMPERS WILL BE TESTED TO DETERMINE THEIR LEVEL OF SWIMMING ABILITY ON THE FIRST DAY OF CAMP. WE ARE HIGHLY ENCOURAGING ALL TEEN TREK CAMPERS TO MAKE AN APPOINTMENT WITH THE POOL STAFF (IF THE POOL OPENS BEFORE CAMP) TO GET TESTED BEFORE CAMP STARTS. LATE ENTERING CAMPERS MUST MAKE ARRANGEMENTS THROUGH THE TEEN CAMP DIRECTOR AND AQUATICS DIRECTOR TO BE TESTED PRIOR TO THEIR FIRST SWIMMING ACTIVITY. CAMPERS MUST BE TESTED AND MUST BRING THEIR BATHING SUIT AND TOWELS ON JUNE 26th FOR THE POOL PARTY.

CAMPERS WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO ATTEND ANY BATHING FACILITY/WATER TRIPS UNTIL THEY HAVE BEEN TESTED.

NON-SWIMMERS MAY BE PROHIBITED FROM ATTENDING CERTAIN WATER RELATED TRIPS (i.e.; Farmington River Tubing) WHERE DIRECT SUPERVISION IS NOT PROVIDED. FINAL TRIP APPROVAL FOR NON-SWIMMERS IS LEFT TO THE DISCRETION OF THE TEEN CAMP DIRECTOR AND THE RECREATION OFFICE.

Medical Forms

New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations require that all children attending private or public day, travel, or sleep away camps must have their medical history on file

BEFORE they may start camp. If you do not have your form on file prior to the start of camp, your child will not be admitted to camp until the form is completed.

If your child is required to take any type of medication during camp hours, a Medical Authorization Form **MUST** be filled out by the primary caregiver **AND** physician, and handed in with the medication the first day your child attends camp. This includes inhalers that may only be needed on an as needed basis. Medication will be left with the camp's on-site assistant health director who will oversee and supervise the child in self-administering their own medication. By law, camp personnel cannot dispense internal medications to the child unless they are a NYS licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or registered nurse. Written permission can be given by both the physician and primary caregiver to allow the camper to carry medication that is needed for emergency purposes (i.e.; epi-pen; asthma inhaler).

Transportation

Bus Rules

Campers will be transported by a Katonah-Lewisboro School bus for all their trips. Bus rules at school apply to camp as well. Proper bus behavior will be strictly enforced. Rules to follow are:

- No sticking any part of the body out of the windows
- No throwing objects in or around the bus or out of the bus
- No shouting from or in the bus
- No standing in or moving through the aisles of the bus
- Campers and staff must remain seated until the bus has come to a complete stop
- No rough housing on the bus
- No speaking to, calling to, or signaling to passing motorists or other persons outside the bus
- No gum chewing at any time on the bus
- No eating or drinking on the bus, except water (unless special permission is given by the bus driver and camp director for extended trips)

Bus Routes

If your child is registered for bus transportation, below is the morning and afternoon drop off/pick up schedule. Please be advised these times are approximate and unforeseen traffic, road construction, weather, etc. may cause an occasional delay. **Please anticipate delays especially for the first week.**

***NOTE: TEEN TREKS CAMPERS ON THE SWIM TEAM WILL WALK ACROSS THE FOOT BRIDGE TO THE BASKETBALL COURTS AND BOARD THE BUS TO JJ HIGH SCHOOL THAT ARRIVES AT 8:45AM.

NOTE: (1) DUE TO THE LARGE NUMBER OF BUS RIDERS AND THE MAXIMUM BUS CAPACITY, WE ASK THAT BUS TRANSPORTATION BE USED ON A REGULAR BASIS AND THAT YOU PRE-REGISTER FOR THIS SERVICE.

(2) WE CANNOT ACCOMMODATE GUESTS ON YOUR CAMPER'S BUS.

(3) THERE IS BUS SERVICE FOR LATE RETURNING TRIPS UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED IN THE SCHEDULE.

Bus Stops

It is the caregiver's responsibility to be at the bus stop to pick up their camper. A written note from the caregiver must be turned into the bus driver if the camper is allowed to walk home from the bus stop, is to be picked up by someone other than their caregiver, or if the camper will not be taking the bus home on a particular day. If a caregiver is going to be delayed, they must notify the Camp Director or Recreation Office and have someone at the bus stop to pick up their camper. We cannot leave your camper unattended without express written consent from a primary caregiver/guardian. **If, after 5 minutes of waiting, your camper is not picked up, they will be brought to the After Hours program (up until 6:00 pm) where the caregiver is expected to pick up the camper if they have not turned in the aforementioned form.** At times, two to three buses may be arriving at a bus stop at one time. In order to assure that all campers are unloaded safely and to account for the children at all times, the caregiver or authorized guardian must approach the bus door to retrieve their camper. At that time your camper will be let off the bus. Transportation is a privilege and can be revoked at any time due to misconduct.

Notes

For the safety of your camper, written parental permission (note) must be sent for the following:

- If your camper is to leave camp with a friend, neighbor, relative or someone other than their usual ride.
- To give your camper permission to walk home from the bus stop without you meeting them there
- To ride a bike home from John Jay High School or their assigned bus stops

If your camper's counselor does not receive a note, your camper will not be released until you have been contacted. For car pools or arrangements that will last the summer, one note specifying the days and persons picking up/dropping off your camper will be kept on file for the summer. Each caregiver must send a note specifying the above. If something changes in your car pool, a new note must be sent.

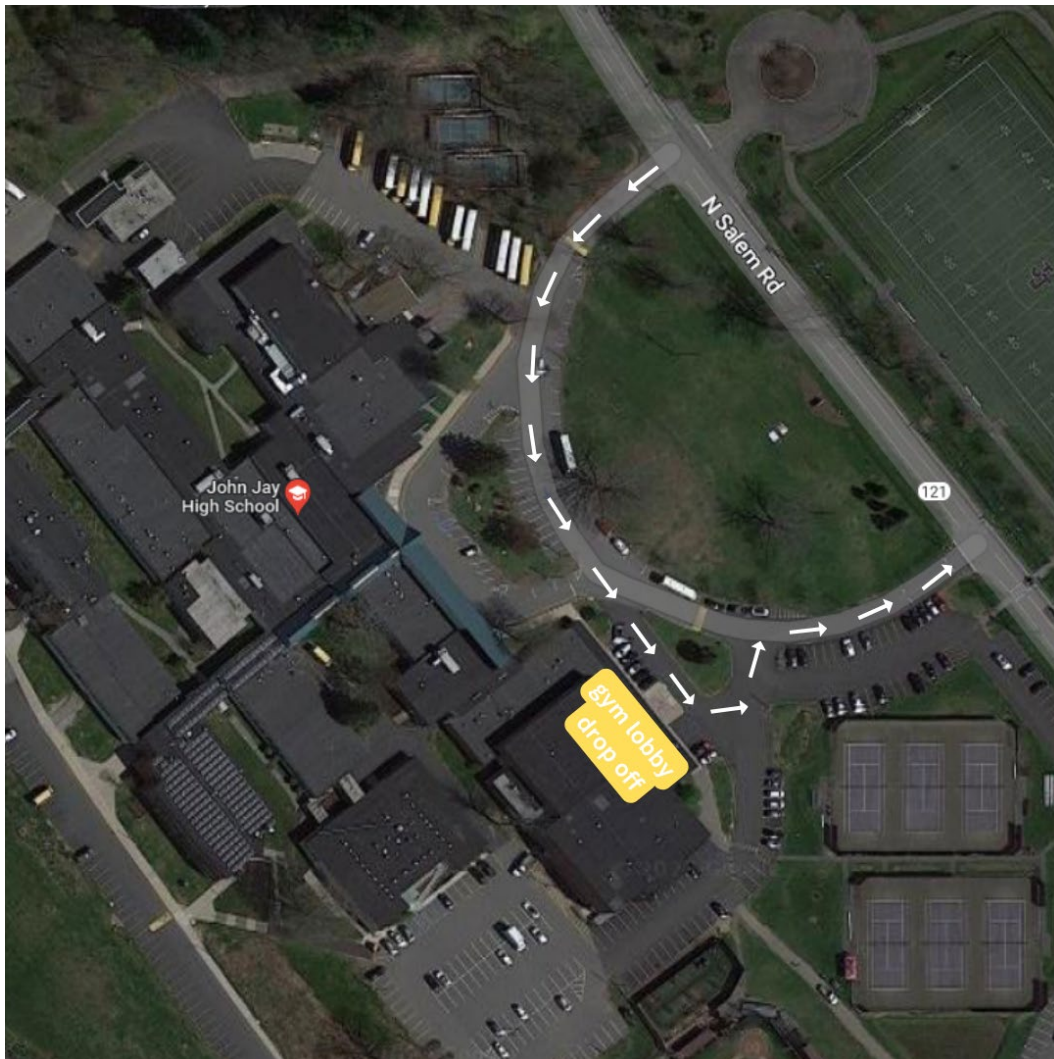
Late Caregivers

In order to cover unbudgeted expenses, the Town will charge \$20/child per every 15 minutes of supervision past program end time with the first 15 minutes as a grace period (unless the grace period is abused consistently.)

Arrivals & Departures

The arrival and departure procedure at each campsite is of utmost importance. We ask that you follow the flow of traffic and the instructions of the traffic coordinator. Parking should only be in the designated parking areas and for the safety of the campers, please do not pass while in line.

Camp Essentials

Camp Shirts

Each camper will receive two camp shirts on their first day of camp. **THESE SHIRTS MUST BE WORN DAILY. YOUR CHILD WILL NOT GO ON ANY TRIPS WITHOUT THEIR T-SHIRT ON.** This helps us identify your camper at the various trip facilities. This is also a New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulation. Additional camp shirts are on sale for \$7 a piece at the Recreation Office. Camp Shirts will be handed out at parent orientation or on the first day of camp to be worn that day.

Lunch and Drink

There are trips that require campers to bring lunch. Campers who will be bringing lunch on trips are asked to bring non-perishable foods only. We recommend sending lunches packed with a freezer pack.

NO GLASS CONTAINERS OR GUM CHEWING ALLOWED ON THE BUSES!

Cashless Parks

Quite a few of the amusement/water parks we are visiting this year have switched to all cashless payment. We suggest that you fill a prepaid debit card for your child for these trips so that they can purchase their lunch. This will minimize the amount of time spent on transferring cash to cards at the parks, and will give campers more time to enjoy the rides and amusements. Cashless parks include: SIX FLAGS GREAT ADVENTURE, CITI FIELD, DORNEY PARK, and LAKE COMPOUNCE. This will be noted in the trip calendar as well.

Additional Expenses

All trips and admissions to facilities are paid for through your registration fees. However, money for lunch (when not included), arcade money, gift shops, souvenirs, etc. are not included. Please consider this before each of your child's trips.

Zero-Tolerance Policy

NOTE - Teen Camp is designed for the mature, responsible teen. We have a **ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY** (please refer to the behavior policy that accompanied your registration forms) if your child is verbally or physically abusive to any of the staff, peers, or other patrons, they will be dismissed from camp without a refund. On some trips, 8th & 9th graders have the opportunity to go off in small groups on their own and have regular meeting times scheduled throughout the day. Abuse of this privilege can result in suspension from camp without credit or refund. We encourage caregivers to explain to their campers the responsibility that comes with being a camper in this camp. If you do not wish your child to be extended this privilege, you must send a note to the Camp Director indicating this.
