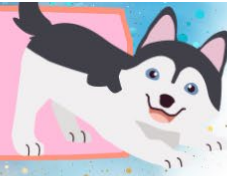

General Camp Information

Operating Schedule

Little Explorers operates Monday through Friday

Camp starts Monday, June 29th and ends Friday, August 7th

No camp on Friday, July 3

Camp Hours: **8:45 AM - 2:45 PM**

Please do not drop off your campers before 8:45 AM. Our staff needs time to prepare for the day and campers will not be allowed in the school before 8:45 AM.

Staff

The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp Program is run under the direction of a trained staff of professionals and counselors. Our Little Explorers Camp Director is Mary Canale and she will be assisted by Lori McCarthy. Our counselor supervisor is Greg Euchner and our Camp Nurses are Ian Ferman and Madyson Itwaru.

Our specialists have experience in their area of specialty as well as working with children. In addition, all our counselors are a minimum 16 years old or over. Most have some experience in working with children and are required to attend a mandatory staff training program as mandated by Westchester County and New York State Board of Health.

Under New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations, we must have one staff member per 200 campers certified in American Red Cross Responding to Emergencies First Aid and one staff member per 200 campers certified in CPR for the Professional Rescuer. The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp exceeds these requirements.

Our Aquatics Director is James DeNoia. This is James's first year as Aquatics Administrator, and it is his second year working in aquatics at the Lewisboro Town Pool. James will be working with his assistant, Sean Maddock, and a team of twelve instructors/lifeguards this upcoming summer overseeing the Town Camp Aquatics.

The Town of Lewisboro works cooperatively with the Katonah-Lewisboro School District who provides all transportation to and from camp under supervision of our transportation coordinator, Chris DiLillo. Chris has been employed with the Town of Lewisboro Parks and Rec summer camp program since 2011. He is so happy to have such an experienced transportation staff that will make for a safe, enjoyable, and successful 2026 summer camp season.

Permit

The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp Program:

- 1) Must have a permit to operate from the Westchester County Health Department
- 2) Is required to be inspected twice yearly by the Westchester County Department of Health

Inspection reports and required camp written safety, medical, and fire safety plans are on file at the Westchester County Health Department (Bureau of Public Health Protection) located in Mount Kisco, NY and are available for your review.

Rainy Day/Thunderstorm Procedures

In the event of rainy days or thunderstorms, the Little Explorers will go directly into Meadow Pond Elementary School and continue with their activities. Our site and hours of operation do not change (with the exception of swim) on rainy days.

If it is only raining, drop off and pick up procedures will remain the same.

In the event of a thunderstorm during dismissal time, the following procedure must be implemented as mandated by the Westchester County Board of Health and as outlined in the Lewisboro Day Camp safety plan:

- Caregivers are strongly encouraged to pick up their camper prior to dismissal time/prior to the thunderstorm if there are signs/warnings/news reports of an approaching thunderstorm.
- If caregivers cannot pick up their child early, caregivers are strongly encouraged to wait until the storm passes and then pick up their camper at the usual dismissal time. Staff will remain with the campers until campers are picked up.
- If caregivers pick-up their child while it is still lightning or thundering, caregivers **MUST** park their car in the designated parking area, and come into the camp office to sign out and pick up their camper.

As per Westchester County Board of Health instructions, camp staff cannot escort campers to cars during a thunderstorm.

NOTE: After Hours campers rainy day location is Lewisboro Elementary School. After hours campers will be transported to Lewisboro Elementary school instead of Town Park in the event of rain and caregivers will be notified of the change in location by 1pm.

Any changes in our daily schedule will be updated on our website at www.lewisbororecreation.com under "CAMP" or follow us on Facebook at Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department and Instagram @lewisboroparks. We will also send out updates via email. Individual phone calls will not be made in the event of a change of dismissal or location.

Important Forms

Medical Forms

New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations require that all children attending private or public day, travel, or sleep away camps must have their medical history on file **BEFORE** they may start camp. If your form is not on file prior to the start of camp, your child will not be admitted into camp until the form is complete. If your child is required to take any type of medication during camp hours, a Medical Authorization Form **MUST** be filled out by the parent **AND** physician, and handed in with the medication the first day your child attends camp. This includes inhalers that may only be utilized on an as needed basis. Medication will be left with the camp's Health Director who will oversee and supervise the child in self-administering their own medication. By law, camp personnel cannot dispense internal medications to the child unless they

are a NYS licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or registered nurse. Written permission can be given by both the physician and parent to allow the camper to carry medication that is needed for emergency purposes (i.e.; epipen; asthma inhaler).

Release Form

When you registered your child for camp, the release form you signed indicates that your child(ren) will participate in regularly scheduled camp activities (i.e.; arts & crafts, swimming) and special events (i.e.; water carnival, moon bounce). If there is an activity you do not wish your child to participate in, you should notify the Camp Director in writing.

Swimming

Your camper will be swimming at the Town Pool on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Fridays every week. We will be bussing campers over during their scheduled swim times. You can find a copy of our swim schedule on our website. Any camper under the age of 4 as of June 29th will be transported in a car seat.

Lil' Tykes Campers (Pre-K) will receive recreational swim in the Town's interactive pool area. Pre-K campers do not need to know how to swim to enjoy the interactive pool.

Kinder Kid and First Grade campers will receive instructional swim lessons which follow the Red Cross guidelines by our Aquatics Director and swim staff. However, all Kinder Kid campers will be classified as non-swimmers. First Grade campers will be tested the first week of camp to determine their skill level. They will then be placed into groups according to their ability within their grade group. Late entering campers will be tested prior to their first swim session. Kinder Kids and First Graders can utilize both the interactive pool and the zero depth entry of the main pool and sometimes receive lessons in the shallow end of the pool.

Under New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations, all non-swimmers must be readily identifiable, i.e.; wear a bathing cap, head band, wrist band, etc. The Town of Lewisboro Day Campers will be using neon wristbands to identify our non-swimmers. Wristbands will be given to each non-swimmer at the beginning of their swim time and collected at the conclusion of their swim time. In addition, our campers who are classified as swimmers will be wearing different neon-colored wristbands. This has been added as an extra level of safety to ensure that a non-swimmer cannot take off their wristband and proceed to a swimmer area. Therefore, all campers must wear a wristband to swim. Any swimming concerns/notes should be sent in writing to your child's counselor. The note should be placed in an envelope and marked on the outside: Attention: James DeNoia, Aquatics Director.

Swim Attire/Gear

Campers must wear their bathing suit under their clothing and bring their change of clothes in their bag/knapsack to change into after their swim time on their regularly scheduled swim days (see schedule on our website). This will alleviate the need for two complete changes which is extremely helpful particularly with our younger campers. On days that your child is not scheduled

to swim, bathing suit and towel should be sent as they may be using sprinklers (particularly on hot days).

We strongly recommend sending your Little Explorers camper with an extra change of clothes for that occasional accident. Please send their change of clothes in a labeled shoe box or Ziploc bag, which will be stored for the summer. The following items are necessary for swim time: bathing suit, towel, hair ties (for children with long hair) and SUNSCREEN. The following items are optional: goggles, bathing cap, brush/combs, ear plugs/wax. We strongly suggest you apply sunscreen to your child prior to going to camp each day and send sunscreen with your child to camp. Counselors will be asked to remind their campers to apply sunscreen throughout the day and at your request will assist younger campers who need help applying it.

All towels, clothes, lunch boxes/bags should be clearly labeled with your child's name to prevent their valuables from ending up in the lost and found.

Change in Arrival/Dismissal & Late Parents

Late Arrivals/Early Departures

Daily attendance will be taken at camp. If you arrive late in the morning or pick up your camper before regular dismissal time, you must sign your camper in/out at the Day Camp office. The Day Camp Office at Meadow Pond Elementary School is located across from the gym. If you will be picking your camper up early, please send a note with your camper to give to their counselor.

PLEASE INCLUDE YOUR CAMPER'S FULL NAME, GROUP, DAY, DATE, and TIME you will be picking up your camper. You can also utilize the change in dismissal form located on the following page.

Notes

For the safety of your camper, written parent/guardian permission must be sent for the following:

- **If your camper is to leave camp with a friend, neighbor, relative, or someone other than their usual ride who is not listed on the Pickup Authorization Form.**
- **If your camper is changing their regular dismissal routine.**

Notes should specify your camper's name, date, group, counselor, and dismissal change as well as any other pertinent information.

** If a note is not submitted to Little Explorers, your camper will not be released until you have been contacted.

FOR BUS RIDERS: Please have your child hand their change in dismissal note directly to the bus driver as soon as they board the bus in the morning. It's helpful to have them board the bus with the note already in their hand so it is not forgotten.

FOR CAR RIDERS: Please have your child hand their change in dismissal note directly to their counselor as soon as they arrive to camp. It's helpful to have them get out of the car with the note already in their hand, this way it does not get lost in their bags during the day and forgotten.

Late Caregivers

In order to cover unbudgeted expenses, the Town will charge \$20/child per every 15 minutes of supervision past program end time with the first 15 minutes as a grace period (unless the grace period is abused consistently.)

Please use the following template if your child will be picked up by someone other than a parent/guardian or someone listed on your pickup authorization form. **This INCLUDES a change of pickup from your child's bus stop.** Detach and hand the form directly to your child's counselor on the appropriate day. **One form per child.** Additional forms will be available in the camp office.

Camp Day Essentials

Clothing

Campers should come to camp as comfortable as possible. Shorts, short sleeve shirts, and sneakers should be worn. **Sandals, flip-flops, or clogs without secure backs should not be worn.** Rain coats and rain gear should be worn in rainy weather.

** Swimsuits should be worn to camp on swim days and brought to camp on all other days. Towels should be brought daily. **

Lunch & Drink

All campers should bring a lunch and drink in a reusable water bottle each day. In addition, please send a **separate** snack and drink for snack time. Lunch boxes or insulated lunch bags should be used with ice packs. **Please, no glass containers!**

Personal Belongings

We ask that parents do not allow their children to bring their own personal belongings to camp (i.e.; toys, books, etc.) unless your camper's group will be having Show and Tell or it has been pre-arranged with the staff. We cannot be responsible for their safekeeping and it sometimes causes friction within the groups, particularly with our younger campers.

End of Camp Day

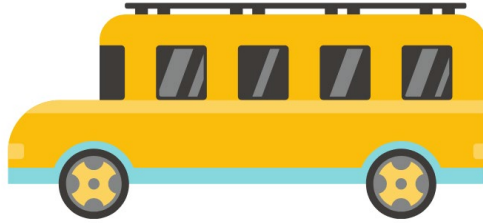
Please be sure to check your camper's bag/knapsack daily for any camp memos or projects that may be coming home.

Arrival/Departure Procedures

The arrival and departure procedure at each campsite is of utmost importance. We ask that you follow the flow of traffic and the instructions of the traffic coordinator(s). Counselors will escort your camper to your car in the pick-up line. If you park, you will need to escort your camper to your car. Parking should only be in designated parking areas and for the safety of the campers, please do not pass while in line.



Buses



If your camper is registered for bus transportation, below you will find the morning and afternoon drop off/pick up schedule. Please be advised these times are approximate and unforeseen traffic, road construction, weather, etc. may cause an occasional delay.

PLEASE ANTICIPATE DELAYS IN TRANSPORTATION DURING THE FIRST WEEK OF CAMP.

If someone besides a child’s primary caregiver or those listed on the pickup authorization form will be picking up your child at the bus stop, a note **must** be sent to the child’s counselor. Children will **not** be released to others if no note is provided.

**** PM Town Park drop-off is only for those enrolled in the AFTER CAMP program.**

NOTE:

(1) Due to the large number of bus riders and the maximum bus capacity, we ask that bus transportation be used on a regular basis and that you pre-register for this service.

(2) We cannot accommodate guests on your child's bus. Therefore, if your child is bringing a friend home from camp and the other child is not a bus rider; both children must be picked up at the camp site.

(3) There is no transportation from the After Hours program. Campers must be picked up at the town park or Lewisboro Elementary at the end of the day.

Car Seats

All Lil' Tykes (Pre-K) campers who are not 4 years old by the beginning of camp season **MUST** use a car seat when being transported to and from the pool for swim time and for off-site trips. If a camper will be turning 4 during camp, they will still use the car seat for the remainder of the summer. The Town of Lewisboro purchased Safety First Grand 2-in-1 car seats and Cosco Kids Finale 2-in-1 car seats for this purpose. All of our car seats were purchased either in 2024 or 2025.

All campers will be individually fitted to their own car seat for the camp season on the first day of camp and that seat will be labeled with their name. Counselors will be trained during staff orientation on how to buckle campers in/out of their seats. Please review this with your camper to ensure smooth transitions to and from the pool and off-site trips.

Bus Stops

It is the caregiver's responsibility to be at the bus stop to pick up their camper. A written note from the primary caregiver must be turned into the bus driver if the child is to be picked up by someone other than their primary caregiver (or someone listed on the pickup authorization form) or if the child will not be taking the bus home on a particular day. If a caregiver is going to be delayed, they must notify the Camp Director and have someone at the bus stop to pick up his or her camper. We cannot leave a child unattended. **If after five minutes of waiting your child is not picked up, they will be brought to the After Hours program at the Lewisboro Town Park where the caregiver is expected to pick up the camper.** Although we understand there are extenuating circumstances, repeated lateness will not be tolerated. At times, two to three buses may be arriving at a bus stop at one time. In order to ensure that all campers are unloaded safely and to account for the children at all times, the caregiver or authorized guardian must approach the bus door to retrieve their child at which time your child will be let off the bus.

Bus Expectations



Bus expectations are implemented for the safety of your children. Our bus drivers are committed to safely transporting your child to their destination. We encourage you to go over these expectations with your child. Failure to follow these rules can result in loss of bus privileges.

- Keep all body parts inside the bus at all times.
- Keep all personal belongings with you in your seat.
- Use indoor voices and speak respectfully.
- Remain seated and stay out of the aisles while the bus is in motion.
- Stay seated until the bus has come to a complete stop.
- Follow all staff member directions (including bus drivers, counselors, & head staff members)
- Keep your body & hands to yourself.
- Focus on fellow campers and staff and avoid interacting with people outside the bus.
- Save all food and drinks for before or after the bus ride, including gum.

Offsite Trips

Please make sure your camper wears their **red** camp shirt on trip days!

½ Day Pre-K campers are welcome to join us on these trips! Generally, they will run about 9am-2pm. If your camper is not attending a trip, they will not have camp that day.


