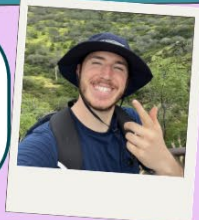

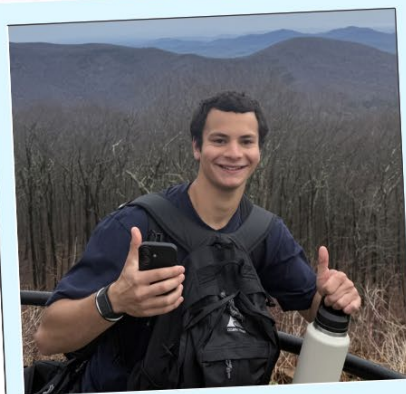

Operating Schedule

Main Event operates Monday through Friday

Parent Orientation

There will be an orientation for parents on **Monday, June 22nd at the LES Gym from 5:30-6:30pm**. You will have the chance to meet our new director, Vania Pelosi, and get familiar with the camp set-up and procedures. Campers will have their own orientation with their counselors on the first day of camp.

Camp Staff

The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp Program is run under the direction of a trained staff of professionals and counselors. Our Main Event Camp Director this year is Vania Pelosi, and she will be assisted by Emma Schulze. Our counselor supervisor is Michelle Verzi and Maria Valvano will be supervising the 6th grade hybrid group. Our camp nurse is Ariana Gulbrandsen, joining us for her second summer at Main Event.

Our specialists have experience in their area of specialty (sports, nature, or art) as well as working with children. In addition, all our counselors are a minimum 16 years old or over. Most have some experience in working with children and are required to attend a mandatory staff training program as mandated by Westchester County and New York State Board of Health.

Under New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations, we must have one staff member per 200 campers certified in American Red Cross Responding to Emergencies First Aid and one staff member per 200 campers certified in CPR for the Professional Rescuer. The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp exceeds these requirements.

Our Aquatics Director is James DeNoia. This is James' first year as Aquatics Director, and it is his second year working in aquatics at the Lewisboro Town Pool (4th overall as a lifeguard). James will be working with his assistant, Sean Maddock, and a team of twelve instructors/lifeguards this upcoming summer overseeing the Town Camp Aquatics.

The Town of Lewisboro works cooperatively with the Katonah-Lewisboro School District who provides all transportation to and from camp under supervision of our transportation coordinator, Chris DiLillo. Chris has been employed with the Town of Lewisboro Parks and Rec summer camp program since 2011. He is very excited to serve as Transportation Coordinator. All of our drivers have returned from the past four years to round out his strong team. He is so happy to have such an experienced transportation staff that will make for a safe, enjoyable, and successful 2026 summer camp season.

Permit

The Town of Lewisboro Day Camp Program:

- 1) Must have a permit to operate from the Westchester County Health Department
- 2) Is required to be inspected yearly

Inspection reports and required camp written safety, medical, and fire safety plans are on file at the Westchester County Health Department, Bureau of Public Health Protection, Mt. Kisco, NY and are available for your review.

RAINY DAY/THUNDERSTORM PROCEDURES

In the event of rainy days or thunderstorms, the Main Event campers must follow the procedure outlined below which is the approved plan for the Lewisboro Day Camp program at Town Park as mandated by the Westchester County Board of Health. The procedure is designed to ensure a safe environment for all.

The rainy-day site for the Main Event Camp is John Jay Middle School. You will receive communication from the administrative staff if the campers need to be moved mid-day. In general, though, where you drop off your camper(s) in the morning is where you will pick them up in the afternoon, whether that is at Town Park or John Jay Middle School.

1. If it is raining and/or lightning and thundering in the morning prior to camp, we will reach out via email to all participants **only** if there is a change of location to JJMS. We will also post any changes to location on our website (www.lewisbororecreation.com) and on our social media accounts: Lewisboro Parks & Recreation on Facebook and @lewisboroparks on Instagram.
2. In the event of rain/thunderstorm/inclement weather at Town Park in the afternoon, (after 1:30 pm), campers will remain at Town Park and 3:00 pm pick-up will be at Town Park. If it is only raining, pick-up procedure will follow what is outlined in the Arrival/Departure procedures.

In the event of a thunderstorm at Town Park during dismissal time, the following procedure must be implemented as mandated by the Westchester County Board of Health and as outlined in the Lewisboro Day Camp Safety Plan:

- Caregivers are strongly encouraged to pick up their camper prior to dismissal time if there are signs, warnings, or news reports of an approaching thunderstorm.
- If caregivers are unable to pick up their camper early, they are strongly encouraged to wait until the storm has passed before arriving for pickup. Staff will remain with campers until they are picked up.
- If a caregiver chooses to pick up their camper while thunder or lightning is still present, they must park in the designated parking area and personally retrieve their camper from the designated meeting area indicated below:

POOL BATH HOUSE - 2nd Graders

CAMP BUSES -3rd and 4th Graders

PAVILION - 5th & 6th Graders

As per Westchester County Board of Health instructions, camp staff cannot escort campers to cars during a thunderstorm.

Note: After Camp's rainy-day location is Lewisboro Elementary School. After Camp participants will be transported to Lewisboro Elementary School after regular camp pickup has ended, and caregivers should pick up their campers there.

IMPORTANT FORMS

Medical Forms

New York State and Westchester County Health Department regulations require that all children attending private or public day, travel, or sleep away camps must have their medical history on file **BEFORE** they may start camp. If your form is not on file prior to the start of camp, your child will not be admitted into camp until the form is complete. If your child is required to take any type of medication during camp hours, a Medical Authorization Form **MUST** be filled out by the parent **AND** physician and handed in with the medication the first day your child attends camp. This includes inhalers that may only be needed on an as needed basis. Medication will be left with the camp's health director who will oversee and supervise the child in self-administering their own medication. By law, camp personnel cannot dispense internal medications to the child unless they are a NYS licensed physician, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or registered nurse. Written permission can be given by both the physician and parent to allow the camper to carry medication that is needed for emergency purposes (i.e.; epi-pen; asthma inhaler).

Release Form

When you registered your child for camp, the release form you signed indicates that your child(ren) will participate in regularly scheduled camp activities (i.e.; arts & crafts, swimming), special events (i.e.; water carnival, moon bounce) and off-site trips. If there is an activity you do not wish your child to participate in, you should notify the Camp Director, Vania Pelosi, in writing.

SWIMMING

Main Event campers will receive instructional swim lessons, which follow the Red Cross guidelines, by our Aquatics Director and swim staff. Main Event campers will be tested the first week of camp to determine their ability level. They will then be placed into groups according to their ability within their grade group. Late entering campers will be tested prior to their first swim session.

Under New York State and Westchester County Department of Health regulations, all non-swimmers must be readily identifiable while participating in aquatic activities. To comply with these requirements, the Town of Lewisboro Day Camp will use red neon wristbands to identify non-swimmers. Wristbands will be distributed at the beginning of swim time and collected at the conclusion of each swim period.

As an additional safety measure, campers who have successfully passed the swim test and are classified as swimmers will wear green neon wristbands. This ensures that all campers in the pool area are clearly identified and helps prevent non-swimmers from entering designated swimmer areas.

All campers must wear their assigned wristband in order to participate in swimming activities.

Any swimming-related concerns or notes should be submitted in writing to your child's counselor. Please place the note in a sealed envelope marked: **Attention: James DeNoia, Aquatics Director.**

Campers who choose not to participate in the swim test will automatically be classified as non-swimmers. Please note that non-swimmers may be restricted from participating in certain water-based activities during field trips, including water attractions at Quassy.

Swim Attire/Gear

Campers should wear their bathing suit under their clothing and bring their change of clothes in their backpack to change into after their swim time on their regularly scheduled swim days. This will alleviate the need for two complete changes which is extremely helpful, particularly with our younger campers. **On days that your child is not scheduled to swim, a bathing suit and towel should be sent as they may be using sprinklers, particularly on hot days.** The following items are necessary for swim time: bathing suit, towel, sunscreen, and hair ties (for children with long hair). The following items are optional: goggles, bathing cap, brush/combs, and ear plugs/wax.

All towels, clothes, lunch boxes/bags should be clearly labeled with your child's name to prevent their valuables from ending up in the lost and found.

CAMP DAY ESSENTIALS

Clothing

Campers should come to camp as comfortable as possible. Shorts, short sleeve shirts, and sneakers should be worn. Sandals are **NOT** recommended. Rain coats and rain gear should be worn in rainy weather. Swimsuits and towels should be brought daily.

Lunch and Drink

All full day campers should bring their lunch and drink each day OR they may purchase a bagged lunch from the pool concession stand. **The lunch order form is included on the last page of the handbook.** The concessionaires will collect order forms at the beginning of the day so please make sure they are completed ahead of time. In addition, you may want to send a separate snack and drink. Lunch boxes or insulated lunch bags with a freezer pack should be used. To ensure a cold drink, you may want to freeze your child's water overnight and allow it to thaw during the day. There is no refrigeration at the Main Event Camp; therefore, lunches should contain non-perishable foods. Limited refrigeration is available for medications, etc. **Please, no glass containers!**

Lunch through Lily's Snack Shack at the pool is \$15 per day, or \$364 for the season (\$14/day for the 26 days of camp that we will be on site). Checks for the full season can be made out to "Lily's Deli" and are due on the first day of camp, June 29th.

Personal Belongings

We ask that parents do not allow their children to bring their own personal belongings to camp (i.e.; toys, ear pods, phones, books, etc.). We cannot be responsible for their safe keeping and it sometimes causes friction within the groups particularly with our younger campers.

End of Camp Day

No child may remain at the pool or camp site unless they are enrolled in the After Hours program.

Please be sure to check your child's backpack daily for any camp memos or projects that may be coming home with your child.

Sunscreen

We suggest you apply sunscreen to your child prior to going to camp each day and send sunscreen with your child to camp. Counselors will be asked to remind their campers to apply sunscreen throughout the day and will assist younger campers who need help applying it if written permission is given to the camp.

CHANGE IN ARRIVAL/DISMISSAL & LATE PARENTS

Late Arrivals/Early Departures

Daily attendance will be taken at camp. If you arrive late in the morning or pick up your camper before regular dismissal time, you must sign your camper in/out at the Day Camp office. The Day Camp Office at Town Park is located under the pavilion. If you are picking your camper up early, you **MUST** send a note with your camper to give to their counselor. **PLEASE INCLUDE YOUR CHILD'S FULL NAME, GROUP, DAY, DATE, and TIME you will be picking up your camper.**

Notes

If you are changing your camper's dismissal, please fill out a change in dismissal form (located on the next page). This must be handed to your camper's counselor on the day of the dismissal change. Please have campers arrive with it **in their hand** so they are ready to give it directly to their counselor. This will help us avoid any lost or forgotten notes. If no note is received by your child's counselor, your child will not be released.

For the safety of your camper, parental permission must be submitted for the following:

- **If your camper is to leave camp with a friend, neighbor, relative, or someone other than their usual ride.**
- **Also, if your child is ill, it is not necessary to call him/her in sick.**

For carpools or arrangements that will last for the summer, one note specifying days and persons picking up/dropping off your camper will be kept on file for the summer. Each parent within the carpool must send a note specifying the above. If something changes in your carpool, a new note must be sent. **Please fill out the pickup authorization form on page 12 and give it to your child's counselor or an office staff member on the first day of camp.**

Late Caregivers

In order to cover unbudgeted expenses, the Town will charge \$20/child per every 15 minutes of supervision past program end time with the first 15 minutes as a grace period (unless the grace period is abused consistently.)

Please use the following template if your child will be picked up by someone other than a parent/guardian or someone listed on your pickup authorization form. **This INCLUDES a change of pickup from your child's bus stop.** Detach and hand the form directly to your child's counselor on the appropriate day. **One form per child.** Additional forms will be available in the camp office.

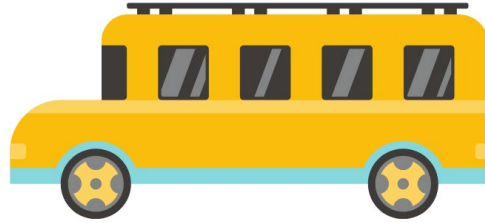
ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE PROCEDURES

The arrival and departure procedures at each camp site are extremely important to the safety and efficiency of our program. We ask that all families follow the established traffic patterns and the directions provided by our traffic coordinators at Town Park.

Below you will find a map detailing the flow of traffic for drop-offs and pickups. As soon as you pull into Town Park, you will drive straight until you reach the circle and then drive back down and pull into the parking lot.



BUSES



If your child is registered for bus transportation, below you will find the morning and afternoon drop off/pick up schedule. Please be advised these times are approximate and unforeseen traffic, road construction, weather, etc. may cause an occasional delay.

Note:

1. Due to the large number of bus riders and maximum bus capacity limits, we ask that bus transportation be used on a regular basis and that families pre-register for this service.
2. We cannot accommodate guests on camp buses. Therefore, if your child is bringing a friend home from camp and the other child is not a registered bus rider, both children must be picked up at the camp site.
3. Transportation is not available for the After Camp program. Campers must be picked up at Town Park at the end of the day, or at Lewisboro Elementary School on rain days.
4. Bus transportation is a privilege and may be revoked at any time due to unsafe or disruptive behavior.

Bus Expectations

Bus rules are implemented for the safety of your children. Our bus drivers are committed to safely transporting your child to their destination. We encourage you to go over these rules with your child. Bus transportation is a privilege and can be revoked at any time due to misconduct during transport.

- Keep all body parts inside the bus at all times.
- Keep all personal belongings with you in your seat.
- Use indoor voices and speak respectfully.
- Remain seated and stay out of the aisles while the bus is in motion.
- Stay seated until the bus has come to a complete stop.
- Follow all staff member directions (including bus drivers, counselors, & head staff members)
- Keep your body & hands to yourself.
- Focus on fellow campers and staff and avoid interacting with people outside the bus.
- Save all food and drinks for before or after the bus ride, including gum.

Bus Stops



It is the caregivers' responsibility to be at the bus stop to pick up their child. Our bus drivers will not release a camper from the bus until you, or the person picking up your child, approach the bus doors. Please do not wait in your car as your child will not be let off the bus to walk to you.

A written note from the primary caregiver must be turned in to the bus driver if the child is allowed to walk home from the bus stop, is to be picked up by someone other than their primary caregiver, or if the child will not be taking the bus home on a particular day. If a caregiver is going to be delayed, they must notify the Camp Director and have someone at the bus stop to pick up their camper. **We cannot leave a child unattended. If after 5 minutes of waiting your child is not picked up, they will be brought to the After Hours program at Town Park where the caregiver is expected to pick up the camper.** Although we understand there are extenuating circumstances, repeated lateness will not be tolerated. At times, two to three buses may be arriving at a bus stop at one time. In order to assure that all campers are unloaded safely and to account for the children at all times, the primary caregiver or authorized guardian must approach the bus door to retrieve their child at which time your child will be let off the bus.

OFFSITE TRIPS (All Grades)

Special event entertainment will be brought into camp as part of their camp program as well. **ALL CAMPERS WHO ATTEND A TRIP MUST WEAR THEIR BLUE CAMP SHIRT!** Due to the strict camper to counselor ratios mandated by both the state and county health departments, we cannot allow campers who do not attend trips to stay back at camp; therefore, there is no camp for those children not attending trips.
