PERMITS

The Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department has a Photo ID system for Town owned tennis facilities. By utilizing this Photo ID permit system, the Parks and Recreation Department will be able to improve the monitoring of our tennis facilities to ensure that only eligible individuals utilize these facilities.

Individuals who need permits may have their photo taken in our office during regular office hours 9:00AM - 4:30PM, Monday thru Friday.

All permits are non-transferable. There is a replacement fee of \$15.00 for a lost or stolen permit.

PERMIT REGULATIONS

The following details who is eligible for the purchase of permits unless otherwise petitioned through the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation: Family Permits: (resident and school district) are reserved for up to two adults, and unmarried children aged 25 and under, and living at home. All other relatives are not considered part of the immediate family, nor are caregivers or housekeepers. Those individuals must purchase their own individual or family permits. Children are required to have a permit beginning at the age of eight for tennis membership.

REGISTRATION POLICY

Non-residents may sign up for programs one week before the start date if space is available.

REGISTRATION

Registration for all programs, unless otherwise specified, is by **mail**, **in person or online** via Webtrac. We cannot accept registrations by phone, email or fax. Incomplete registrations are subject to being returned to sender. We cannot be responsible for lost or misdirected mail.

PLEASE NOTE: The Department does not confirm registrations. You will only be contacted if there is a problem or the program is cancelled.

CREDIT CARDS

We now accept credit cards. Please set up an account if you haven't done so already. If you have ever registered for a Park and Recreation program before, you have an account set up. We will be glad to assist you if help is needed. A 3% service fee will appear as a separate charge from Card Connect on your bank or credit card statement for use of a credit card either with online registration or in the office.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department is committed to ensuring that individuals with disabilities are able to utilize and enjoy our programs and activities to the fullest extent possible. When registering, please let us know if you or a family member have any special needs that we can accommodate (such as wheelchair access, hearing aids, braille printed matter, etc.).

ENROLLMENT

For most programs to be conducted, a minimum enrollment must be reached. In addition, there is usually a maximum enrollment based on the facility size and the instructor's requirements. Therefore, registration is always on a first come, first served basis. We encourage people to register on time!

LATE PICK UPS

Subject to all Town of Lewisboro sponsored programs: All participants are expected to be picked up at the assigned program end time. Any and all tardy pickups from programs will result in additional charges to cover the Town's unbudgeted expenses. The town will charge \$20 per every 15 minutes of supervision past program end time with the first 15 minutes as a grace period unless the grace period is abused consistently.

REFUNDS/CREDITS

The Town of Lewisboro has a no refund policy. However, a refund will be given only under the following conditions:

- 1. A refund/credit will be given if the program is cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department prior to the program's start.
- If a participant moves from Town, a full or pro-rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. Proof of re location must be presented.
- 3. If participant becomes ill or injured a full or pro-rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. A doctor's medical note must accompany the request.

In addition to the above, a \$25.00 processing fee for all refunds/credits that are approved will be assessed, except for programs cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department. All refund requests must be made in writing to the Recreation Supervisor for consideration. Approved refunds will be paid by Town youcher.

RETURNED CHECKS

If a check is returned to the Parks & Recreation Department for any reason, a cash or money order payment of \$20.00 will be required in order to re-deposit your check and offset the expenses incurred by the Town.

PROGRAM CANCELLATIONS

Generally, programs are not held when school is not in session. Please check with the instructor or coach of the particular program, call the Recreation Office at 232-6162, check our website at www.lewisbororecreation.com or visit us on Facebook under Lewisboro Parks and Recreation.

INSURANCE

The Town of Lewisboro carries a Standard Liability Policy, which does not include accident coverage. Therefore, individuals who do not have their own accident coverage participate at their own risk.

PARK USE REGARDING DOGS

Please be reminded that while dogs are permitted in Town parks/ preserves they must be leashed at ALL times and owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dog. **OFF LEASH DOGS ARE NOT PERMITTED** in any of the Town properties. Dogs are **NOT** permitted in any of the playground areas or the pool facility at any time. For safety and sanitary reasons it is requested that dogs not be walked on any of the athletic fields located in the parks.

A FRIENDLY REMINDER

Our Department is asking for assistance and cooperation in helping keep our park and preserve facilities clean for the benefit of all of our park patrons and their guests. Please use the trash and/or recycling receptacles provided to dispose of waste and debris. Athletic teams, clubs and groups are encouraged to police the fields, dugout/bench and spectator areas after practices and games. Please help our Parks staff keep our parks clean. Thank you.

COOPERATING AGENCIES

A FALL MESSAGE FROM THE LEWISBORO STORMWATER COMMITTEE

Accelerated growth of aquatic plants and toxic algae causes problems in lakes, drinking water reservoirs, and rivers. Pollution adds nutrients, especially phosphorus, which enables this growth. One pound of phosphorus can result in 500 pounds of plant growth. A little goes a long way! Help reduce the amount of phosphorus leaving your property by:

Pumping your septic system at least every 5 years as required by law. The septic system collects the phosphorus in the human waste and disburses it into the septic fields. Phosphorus will then bind with the soil in the fields and not runoff in the stormwater.

Leaving the leaves where they fall in wooded areas. This will minimize runoff, protect bare earth from erosion, and the leaves will decompose naturally. These leaves provide nutrients for trees and other habitat for wild animals.

Using a mulching mower on your lawn and leaves.

Minimizing impervious surfaces that speed runoff and reduce the absorption of water and nutrients.

Picking up pet waste and disposing of it in the trash so rain doesn't carry that pollution into streams and waterbodies.

Not using lawn fertilizer with phosphorus which is now banned in New York State.



Get pumped! Septic, that is.

Pump out your septic system! It's a good idea to maintain your septic system. And now it is the law.

To protect the quality of the area's drinking water, Westchester County and Lewisboro instituted a septic system inspection requirement in 2011. Septic systems are a source of phosphorus which can devastate Lewisboro's lakes and watercourses, destroying much of the scenery that makes our Town such a wonderful place in which to live. This law requires that each septic system be pumped at least once during every 5 year period. Failure to do so may result in significant fines.

This means that if you haven't had your septic system pumped since Fall of 2017, it's time to do so NOW. Many septic systems need pumping more often than every 5 years, depending on usage or condition. Have your septic system pumped out this season by an authorized Westchester County septic hauler.

Keep your copy of the septic system inspection report as proof if records get lost. Bureaucracies are not perfect and the report is the only proof that you obeyed the law!



Each household will be able to register for one hour play time (if no one signed up after you and no one is waiting to play, you can play longer).




