Dear Lewisboro Residents:

Spring is around the corner and after having the coldest winter in 20+ years, I am sure everyone is ready for Spring weather. With Spring comes a new season for our Parks & Recreation department. I guarantee you that 2026 will be another banner recreation year for our Town. Our Parks & Recreation department continues to provide some amazing programming & events while continuing to focus on facility improvements.

Update on facility improvements;

- Onatru Park Farm has a newly renovated bathroom facility, and we expanded the paving to include the former dirt parking lot on left side of driveway
- Fox Valley's bathroom will get a new water system which is currently in the design phase, and we hope to have a system which will allow us to expand the seasonal use by a couple of months. The interior of the bathroom will also be renovated as a second phase to the ADA (Americans Disability Act) improvements which included the new driveway and ADA parking in phase 1.
- Pool Bath House: Is looking really good, stop by and check it out. To be completed before the start of the pool season
- Pickleball: We haven't given up, we were not lucky with a prior NYS grant application, but we have tried again for the needed additional funds which will help with building 8 courts in the former tennis courts at Town Park.

The great support that Parks & Rec receives from the residents is terrific and so I thank all residents for their continued support of this fabulous department. 

PERMITS

The Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department has a Photo ID permit system for both the Town owned tennis facilities, paddle tennis courts and the Town Park Pool. By utilizing this system, the Parks and Recreation Department is able to improve the monitoring of our pool and tennis facilities to insure that only eligible individuals utilize these facilities.

Tennis: To renew your tennis memberships, simply mail in your 2025 photo ID cards, check and registration form to our office or renew your membership online.

Pool: All new pool members and children who have reached the age of two this past year will be required to get new photo ID cards. Each person, ages 2 and older, must come to the Recreation Office to have a photo taken and you will receive your new permit before you leave. These permits are PVC cards with a design and bar code. In order to speed up the process we urge you to mail in your registration form and payment prior to having photos taken. Please read information regarding pool permits under the pool section of this brochure.

PLEASE NOTE: Individuals who were members last year only need to mail in a check and registration form and your permits will be renewed electronically.

All permits are non-transferable. There is a replacement fee of \$15.00 for a lost or stolen permit or key.

PERMIT REGULATIONS

The following details who is eligible for the purchase of permits unless otherwise petitioned through the Supervisor of Parks and Recreation: Family Permits: Are reserved for up to two adults and unmarried children aged 25 and under, and living at home. All other relatives are not considered part of the immediate family, nor are caregivers or housekeepers. Those individuals must purchase one of the new permits or pay the daily fee. Children are required to have a permit beginning at age two (2) for pool membership and age eight (8) for tennis membership.

TOWN RESIDENT: lives in the Town of Lewisboro and pays both Town of Lewisboro and Katonah-Lewisboro School District taxes.

SCHOOL DISTRICT RESIDENT: lives outside the Town of Lewisboro and pays only Katonah-Lewisboro School District taxes.

REGISTRATION – SPRING/SUMMER BEGINS MARCH 18TH

Registration for all programs, unless otherwise specified, is by **mail, in person or online** via WebTrac. We cannot accept registrations by phone, email or fax. Incomplete registrations are subject to being returned to sender. We cannot be responsible for lost or misdirected mail.

Please note: The Department does NOT confirm registrations.

CREDIT CARDS

We accept credit cards. If you have ever registered for a Parks and Recreation program, an account has been created for you. We will be glad to assist you if help is needed. If you are new to our system, please go to www.lewisbororecreation.com and click on create an account. A 3% service fee will appear as a separate charge from Card Connect on you bank or credit card statement from credit card transactions which occur online or in the office.

ENROLLMENT

For most programs to be conducted, a minimum enrollment is required. In addition, there is usually a maximum enrollment based on the facility size and the instructor's requirements. Therefore, registration is always on a first come, first served basis.

LATE PICK UPS

Subject to all Town of Lewisboro sponsored programs: All participants are expected to be picked up at the assigned program end time. Any and all tardy pickups from programs will result in additional charges to cover the Town's unbudgeted expenses. The Town will charge \$20/child per every 15 minutes of supervision past program end time with the first 15 minutes as a grace period unless the grace period is abused consistently.

REFUNDS/CREDITS

The Town of Lewisboro has a no refund policy. However, a refund/credit will be considered only under the following conditions:

1. A full refund will be given if the program is cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department prior to the program's start.
2. If a participant moves from Town, a full or pro-rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. Proof of relocation must be presented.
3. If a participant becomes ill or injured, a full or pro-rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. A doctor's medical note must accompany the request.

In addition to the above, a \$25.00 processing fee for all refunds/credits that are approved will be assessed, except for programs cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department. All refund requests must be made in writing to the Supervisor of Parks & Recreation for consideration. Approved refunds will be paid by Town voucher.

RETURNED CHECKS

If a check is returned to the Parks & Recreation Department for any reason, a cash or money order payment of \$20.00 will be required in order to re-deposit your check and off set the expenses incurred by the Town.

PROGRAM CANCELLATIONS

Generally, programs are not held when school is not in session. Please check with the instructor or coach of the particular program or call the Recreation Office at 232-6162. You can also check the website for more information at www.lewisbororecreation.com or Facebook under Lewisboro Parks and Recreation.

INSURANCE

The Town of Lewisboro carries a Standard Liability Policy, which does not include accident coverage. Therefore, individuals who do not have their own accident coverage participate at their own risk.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department is committed to ensuring that individuals with disabilities are able to utilize and enjoy our programs and activities to the fullest extent possible. When registering, please let us know if you or a family member have any special needs (such as wheelchair access, hearing aids, braille printed matter, etc.)

PRESERVE/PARK USE REGARDING DOGS

Please be reminded that while dogs are permitted in Town parks and preserves, they must be leashed at ALL times and owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dog. **OFF LEASH DOGS ARE NOT PERMITTED** in any of the Town Properties. Dogs are **NOT** permitted in any of the playground areas or the pool facility at any time. For safety and sanitary reasons, dogs are not to be run/walked on any of the athletic fields located in the parks.

PLEASE LICENSE YOUR DOG

Just a friendly reminder that any person owning or harboring a dog within the Town of Lewisboro for a period of one week or more should purchase a dog license pursuant to Article 7 of the New York State Agriculture and Markets Law. Licenses shall not be required for dogs under the age of four months. Each license issued shall be valid for a period of one year and shall not be transferable.

A FRIENDLY REMINDER

The Parks and Recreation Department is asking for assistance and cooperation in helping keep our park and preserve facilities clean for the benefit of all of our park patrons and their guests. Please use the trash and/or recycling receptacles provided to dispose of waste and debris. Athletic teams, clubs and groups are encouraged to police the fields, dugout/bench and spectator areas after practices and games. Please help our Parks staff keep our facilities clean. Thank you.

A MESSAGE FROM THE LEWISBORO STORMWATER COMMITTEE

The Town of Lewisboro takes stormwater management seriously. Many pollutants can be carried into our lakes, rivers, streams, and drinking water by polluted stormwater runoff after storms. These contaminants can include plastics, dog poop, sediment, grease, oil, tire residue from roads, and pesticides & fertilizers from lawns and landscaped areas. In our community, phosphorus pollution is a special concern for area drinking water. In lakes and rivers, phosphorus acts like fertilizer for algae and plants. One pound of phosphorus in runoff can produce approximately 500 pounds of plant growth.

Stormwater runoff can't carry as much sediment and pollutants to downstream waterbodies and to drinking water sources if it is slowed and given time to soak into the ground, which acts as a natural filter. The Town consistently sweeps streets and cleans out catch basins to both pick up pollution after it leaves your property and to ensure the stormwater infrastructure is working properly. You, as a homeowner, are the first line of defense and can take simple steps to properly manage stormwater runoff before it reaches the streets.

Smart lawn care:

- Reduce the need for fertilizer, pesticides, and watering. Let your grass grow to about 3" high to help it shade out new weeds and retain moisture. Overseed to crowd out weeds.
- Leave clippings after mowing to return nutrients to the lawn.
- Use fertilizer with care. Fertilizer containing phosphorus is prohibited for use on established lawns. Check your fertilizer bag to ensure the middle number is zero. Don't fertilize when rain is expected.
- Aerate your lawn with a core aerator to improve absorption and reduce stormwater runoff.

Other yard care suggestions:

- Consider reducing lawn areas with beds of native plants, which typically require less water, fertilizer, and care. Native plants are especially important near wet areas.
- Mulch any bare spots to limit the amount of soil that will get carried away by stormwater runoff.
- Pick up pet poop and throw it in your trash.
- Opt for permeable surfaces, such as gravel or permeable pavers, where possible to allow rainwater to percolate into the ground.

SEPTIC SYSTEMS

Pump out your septic systems!

Most of the Town of Lewisboro is served by individual on-site wastewater treatment systems, usually called septic systems. These systems require routine maintenance to operate correctly and to prolong their useful life. While most experts recommend pumping and inspecting your system every 2 to 3 years, Town law requires pumping each septic tank at a minimum of once every 5 years.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

The septic tank separates solid particles, which sink to the bottom of the tank, and oil and grease, which float to the top, from the effluent which flows out to the septic fields. If the layers of either the sludge on the bottom of the tank or the scum on the top of the tank get too thick, they can flow out to the fields and gum them up. Then septic water won't be able to percolate into the ground where it will get filtered. Septic systems need the effluent to interact with the soil to continue treatment for pathogens and phosphorus. Have your system pumped by an authorized vendor and keep the receipt.

If you haven't had your system pumped since 2021, it's time to do so now. If you can't remember when your system was last pumped, please consider pumping this year. Failure to pump your system can lead to significant fines. It's much better to keep that invisible system working properly than to have it become a visible problem!

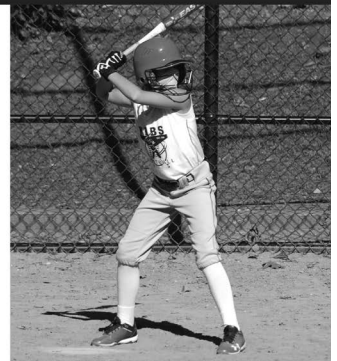

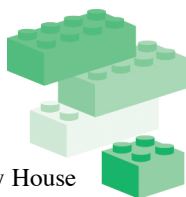

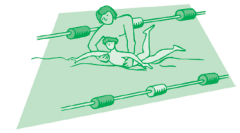

RACQUET SPORTS

The Town of Lewisboro offers our residents two locations for tennis play. There are four all weather courts at Fox Valley Park in Goldens Bridge. There are four Hadeka soft surface tennis courts at Onatru Farm Park on Elmwood Road in South Salem. A reservation system is in place again this year using Court Reserve. All tennis permit holders will receive the link to download the app for their court reservations. Only permit holders will be able to reserve court time. Each household will be able to register for an one hour play time (if no one signed up after you and no one is waiting to play, you can play longer).

Here are some policies with Tennis Court usage for the 2026 season.

You must have a permit to play.

- Each permit holder may have ONE guest per visit.
- For doubles, there must be two permit holders on the court for two guests.
- **ABSOLUTELY NO LESSONS ARE PERMITTED UNLESS OFFERED BY THE TOWN OF LEWISBORO.** No exception of any kind will be considered or permitted.

Individuals who were members last year can renew online at www.lewisbororecreation.com and we will mail the key and permit to you unless YOU email recreation4@lewisborony.gov and make arrangements for your key to be picked up so you can play right away.

All new tennis members will have to come to the office for a photo ID and pick up a key.

The tennis season for Fox Valley Park runs from April 1st through November 30th. Onatru Park tennis courts will open on May 1st through November 30th (weather permitting).

PLEASE NOTE: The tennis courts at Fox Valley are used by the Katonah-Lewisboro School District and for our Town tennis lessons from April 1st through mid-June. A complete schedule of usage is on Court Reserve.

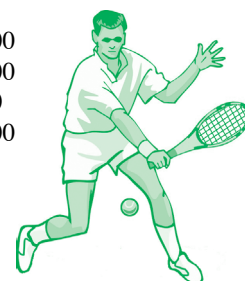
