Dear Lewisboro Residents:

I hope that 2026 has been a great year for everyone. We are now getting ready for the Parks & Recreation Fall programs. As the saying goes; Time flies when you're having fun. 😊

Regarding our facilities improvements, here are some updates: We have a new Pool Bath House, and I highly recommend checking it out, it is a great enhancement to our amazing pool facility. In addition to the upgraded Onatru bathrooms we are now working on the Fox Valley Park bathrooms which will have a new water system, and updated fixtures and interior, paid for by a NYS grant. For the pickleball players, we still have new courts on our to-do list at Town Park. We were not successful in securing the additional needed grant, but will figure out next steps. If you haven't noticed, we now have photovoltaic solar panels on the main barn at Onatru, we expect that all of Onatru electricity requirements will be offset by these solar panels. This was made possible by a NYS grant.

We had another wonderful Fireworks show at Onatru Farm Park, this is a favorite of many residents and once again this year it was spectacular especially as we were celebrating the 250th anniversary of the United States and the Declaration of Independence. We had for the first time a Town History tent at the fireworks and our Town Historian Maureen Koehl set up a wonderful display of Lewisboro History. We had another successful Summer Camp enjoyed by many children in our community.

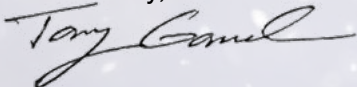

PERMITS

The Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department has a Photo ID system for Town owned tennis facilities. By utilizing this Photo ID permit system, the Parks and Recreation Department will be able to improve the monitoring of our tennis facilities to ensure that only eligible individuals utilize these facilities.

Individuals who need permits may have their photo taken in our office during regular office hours 9:00AM - 4:30PM, Monday thru Friday.

All permits are non transferable. There is a replacement fee of \$15.00 for a lost or stolen permit.

PERMIT REGULATIONS

The following details who is eligible for the purchase of permits unless otherwise petitioned through the Superintendent of Parks and Recreation: Family Permits: (resident and school district) are reserved for up to two adults, and unmarried children aged 25 and under, and living at home. All other relatives are not considered part of the immediate family, nor are caregivers or housekeepers. Those individuals must purchase their own individual or family permits. Children are required to have a permit beginning at the age of eight for tennis membership.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Fall program registration starts on **Wednesday, September 2nd.**

REGISTRATION POLICY

Non-residents may sign up for programs one week before the start date if space is available.

REGISTRATION

Registration for all programs, unless otherwise specified, is by **mail, in person or online** via Webtrac. We cannot accept registrations by phone, email or fax. Incomplete registrations are subject to being returned to sender. We cannot be responsible for lost or misdirected mail.

PLEASE NOTE: The Department does not confirm registrations. You will only be contacted if there is a problem or the program is cancelled.

CREDIT CARDS

We accept credit cards. Please set up an account if you haven't done so already. If you have ever registered for a Park and Recreation program before, you have an account set up. We will be glad to assist you if help is needed. A 3% service fee will appear as a separate charge from Card Connect on your bank or credit card statement for use of a credit card either with online registration or in the office.

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The Lewisboro Parks and Recreation Department is committed to ensuring that individuals with disabilities are able to utilize and enjoy our programs and activities to the fullest extent possible. When registering, please let us know if you or a family member have any special needs that we can accommodate (such as wheelchair access, hearing aids, braille printed matter, etc.).

ENROLLMENT

For most programs to be conducted, a minimum enrollment must be reached. In addition, there is usually a maximum enrollment based on the facility size and the instructor's requirements. Therefore, registration is always on a first come, first served basis. We encourage people to register on time!

LATE PICK UPS

Subject to all Town of Lewisboro sponsored programs: All participants are expected to be picked up at the assigned program end time. Any and all tardy pickups from programs will result in additional charges to cover the Town's unbudgeted expenses. The town will charge \$20 per every 15 minutes of supervision past program end time with the first 15 minutes as a grace period unless the grace period is abused consistently.

REFUNDS/CREDITS

The Town of Lewisboro has a no refund policy. However, a refund will be given only under the following conditions:

1. A refund/credit will be given if the program is cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department prior to the program's start.
2. If a participant moves from Town, a full or pro rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. Proof of re location must be presented.
3. If a participant becomes ill or injured a full or pro rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions the participant attended. A doctor's medical note must accompany the request.

In addition to the above, a \$25.00 processing fee for all refunds/credits that are approved will be assessed, except for programs cancelled by the Parks & Recreation Department. All refund requests must be made in writing to the Recreation Supervisor for consideration. Approved refunds will be paid by Town voucher.

RETURNED CHECKS

If a check is returned to the Parks & Recreation Department for any reason, a cash or money order payment of \$20.00 will be required in order to re-deposit your check and offset the expenses incurred by the Town.

INSURANCE

The Town of Lewisboro carries a Standard Liability Policy, which does not include accident coverage. Therefore, individuals who do not have their own accident coverage participate at their own risk.

PRESERVE/PARK USE REGARDING DOGS

Please be reminded that while dogs are permitted in Town parks and preserves, they must be leashed at ALL times and owners are responsible for cleaning up after their dog. **OFF LEASH DOGS ARE NOT PERMITTED** in any of the Town Properties. Dogs are **NOT** permitted in any of the playground areas or the pool facility at any time. For safety and sanitary reasons, it is requested that dogs not be walked on any of the athletic fields located in the parks.

A FRIENDLY REMINDER

Our Department is asking for assistance and cooperation in helping keep our park and preserve facilities clean for the benefit of all of our park patrons and their guests. Please use the trash and/or recycling receptacles provided to dispose of waste and debris. Athletic teams, clubs and groups are encouraged to police the fields, dugout/bench and spectator areas after practices and games. Please help our Parks staff keep our parks clean. Thank you.

A MESSAGE FROM THE LEWISBORO STORMWATER COMMITTEE

As the seasons change, we might not spend as much time thinking about our local waterbodies. We've paused fishing in the streams, boating on the lakes and reservoirs, or watching dragonflies dart above wetlands. But our actions during this period can have dramatic impacts on the health of the waters around us and upon our drinking water supply.

During the spring and summer, trees, shrubs, and grasses all absorb phosphorus from the soils as they grow, but with the onset of cooler weather, they shed leaves and reduce growth. The discarded leaves and grasses all contain phosphorus which can be released into our waterbodies. As the ground becomes less absorbent, any rainfall will carry more polluted runoff. Phosphorus that runs off this fall and winter can cause plant and algae growth in the spring. Additional phosphorus accelerates the growth of aquatic plants and toxic algae: a pound of phosphorus enables the growth of 500 pounds of aquatic plants and algae.

As you deal with leaves this fall, do not blow them into lakes, streams, or ponds. If you use a landscaping service, make sure they don't use waterbodies as a convenient but polluting disposal system. Gather the leaves into a compost pile away from the water, or use a mulching mower to produce natural fertilizer for your lawn.

In wooded areas or garden beds, let the leaves stay where they fall. That will eliminate erosion from bare soil and will minimize runoff. Leaves also provide important winter habitat for wild animals including some pollinators.

You can take actions to improve the environment and reduce stormwater pollution. Please commit to do as many as you can.

- I will check to see when my septic system was last pumped and if it hasn't been done in the last 2 or 3 years (5 years is the legal maximum), I will have it pumped.

- I will use water efficiently so I won't overload my septic system, which can shorten its life.
- I will not use lawn fertilizer containing phosphorus since it is against the law. I won't spread fertilizer on frozen ground.
- I will use a mulching mower that mulches grass cuttings and leaves while mowing or compost leaves and other yard waste.
- I will cover bare soil with grass seed and mulch to prevent erosion of earth and its associated phosphorus.
- I will pick up after my pets and dispose of their waste in the trash.
- If I live near a lake, stream or wetland, I will plant a native buffer or rain garden to slow the flow of rainwater or stormwater. This will allow more water to soak into the ground rather than flow over it carrying pollutants directly into the body of water.
- I will plant native plants which need less water and fertilizer to thrive.
- I will check my car for oil and antifreeze leaks and have any leaks fixed.
- I will minimize my use of salt to that which is needed for safety.

MAINTAIN YOUR SEPTIC SYSTEM TO PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT

A properly functioning septic system can protect the health of individuals and the environment. If you maintain your septic system, you can extend its life and prevent pollution of drinking water and recreational resources.

Pump out your septic system regularly! It's the law to pump at least every 5 years!

To protect drinking water in our area, Town law requires that septic systems be pumped at least once every 5 years. Experts recommend pumping out older systems and those in fragile environments every 2 to 3 years.

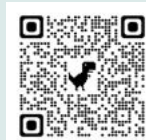

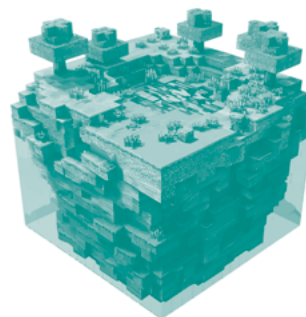

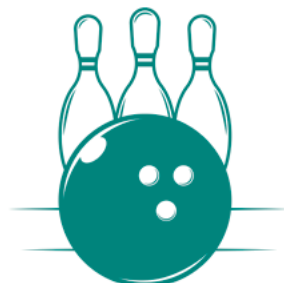

2. Individuals who have a valid 2026 tennis permit do not need to purchase a new permit for the fall season.
3. The tennis courts at Fox Valley are used by the Katonah-Lewisboro School District from September through October, Mondays through Fridays, 3:30PM – 6:30PM.

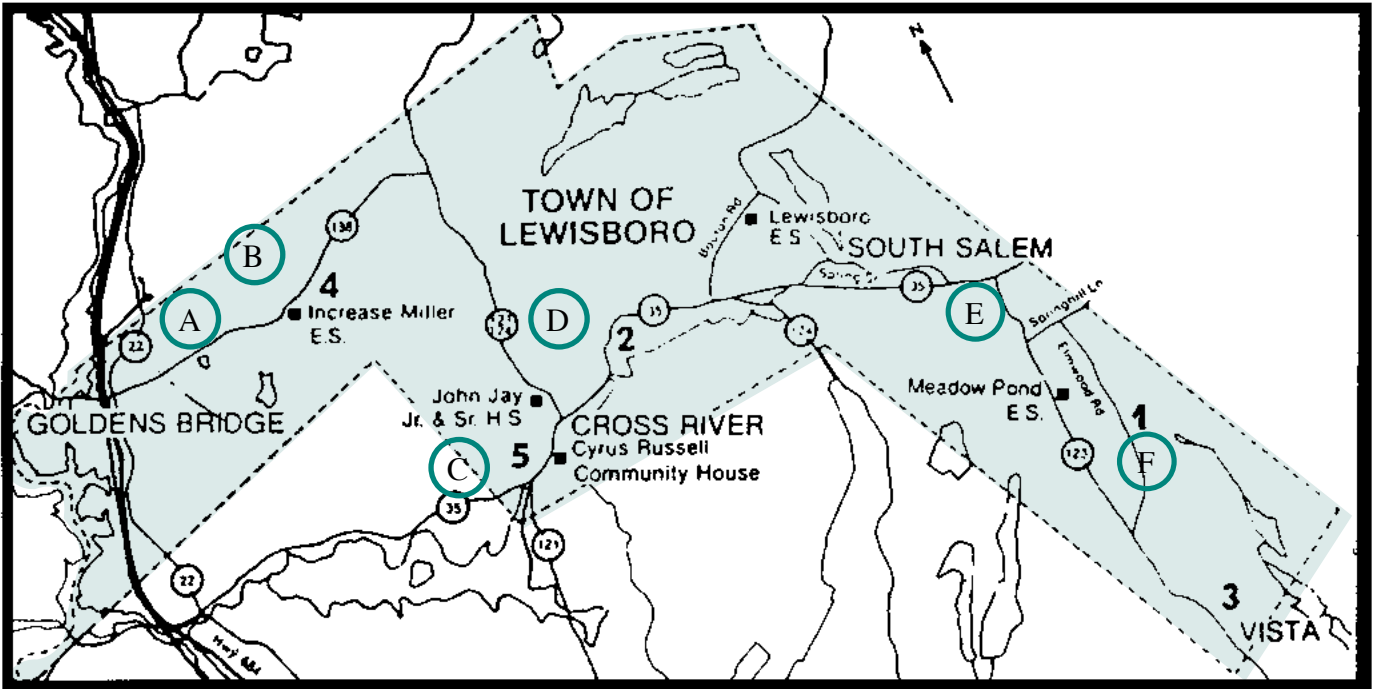
